

PATH TO BELLPUIG

The Bellpuig complex, and in particular the church, is one of the best-preserved examples of what is known as repopulation architecture. As a result of these inherent values, it has been declared an Asset of Cultural Interest, in the monuments category.

The Council of Mallorca owns the complex of the former priory of Bellpuig d'Artà, after it was donated in 1998 by the Truyols i Rovira family. The space has undergone diverse transformations throughout history. The archaeological research was conducted between 1998 and 2024.
